The professional experience I have had at my current position as a User Experience Student Assistant, while invaluable, has assisted my professional development in only so many areas. For example, I stand behind the circulation desk and help library patrons locate the materials they seek. This entails that I have familiarity not only with where our bibliographic items are shelved, but also with how information is organized and cataloged according to the Library of Congress Classification System. I also facilitate patrons' information needs, e.g., I check items out to patrons, field their questions, and walk them through several processes; indeed, this has helped me garner much first-hand knowledge of polysemous words and, by extension, alerted me to the importance of building controlled vocabularies. I have, however, had relatively little experience interpreting analytics (e.g., circulation statistics), and I have, at present, only preliminary knowledge of specific research methods (e.g., content analysis, discourse analysis) that I believe I can, upon further development, effectively use to conduct bibliometric studies and so produce research that may aid professional catalogers. My expectation is that a mentor will help me impose a stricter regimen on myself, improve my metacognitive abilities, and enlighten me on opportunities I can and shall pursue.
